# Message From Our Pastor

My dear people of God,

Many measures have been adopted to stop the spread of this deadly virus, COVID-19. These measures are impacting all of us in various ways. Some of that impact is on our spiritual life. We are accustomed to going to Church to pray, for Mass, and to receive Holy Communion. It is important for us to remember at this time the words of Christ spoken to the woman at the well. "The days are coming when true worshipers will worship the Lord neither in Jerusalem nor on this mountain, but in spirit and in truth." God is ever present and present everywhere. He is present at your home, He is present in your car, He is present wherever you are right now. So let us continue to call upon the Lord at all times and in every space.

Since our normal opportunities to receive the Eucharist is at our daily and Sunday Masses, and we cannot gather together in that form at this time, it is important that we know that we can still satisfy the reception of Communion by making an Act of Spiritual Communion, in which we make an Act of Faith in Christ and in His Presence in the Eucharist, an Act of Love; a desire to receive Christ; and an invitation for Him to come into our hearts. So I encourage all of you, at this difficult time, when we cannot come together for Mass, to make this Act of Spiritual Communion, every day and as often as you can. Hold onto your faith; we shall get through this.

# AN ACT OF SPIRITUAL COMMUNION

My dear Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, at this hour, I join Your faithful people at every Altar of the Church, where Your Precious Body and Blood is being offered to the Father, and give You thanks and praise. I believe that nothing can stop me from receiving You spiritually in my heart, from anywhere I am, at any time, day or night. How I long to receive you, right now, in the sacrament of Holy Communion from your Holy Altar. Since I cannot do so at this time, I beseech You to feed me with the manna of Your Holy Spirit and nourish me with Your holy presence. I lovingly embrace You, at this moment, as if I have actually received You. I present to You my body, my soul, my mind and my spirit, with the earnest wish that I may forever be united to You; never permit me to be separated from your love; and let me live and die in Your grace, Amen.



### THE FEAST OF DIVINE MERCY APRIL 19, 2020



First say one 'Our Father', 'Hail Mary', and 'I believe'. Then on the large beads say the following words:

'Eternal Father, I offer You the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your dearly beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world. 'On the smaller beads you are to say the following words: 'For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.' In conclusion you are to say these words three times:

#### 'Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world'.

"Say unceasingly this chaplet that I have taught you. Anyone who says it will receive great Mercy at the hour of death. Priests will recommend it to sinners as the last hope. Even the most hardened sinner, if he recites this Chaplet even once, will receive grace from My Infinite Mercy. I want the whole world to know My Infinite Mercy. I want to give unimaginable graces to those who trust in My Mercy... When they say this Chaplet in the presence of the dying, I will stand between My Father and the dying person not as the just judge but as the Merciful Savior."
