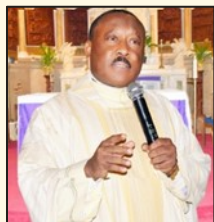

Message From Our Pastor



Dear Parishioners,

We need You to Serve as a Minister of Hospitality



Sometime last year, I went to Wal-Mart for shopping, and what a welcoming experience it was when I was greeted by a smiling employee at the door who said to me, "Welcome to Wal-Mart and have a great day". As I entered into the shopping area, smiling, I said to myself, how worthy and nice it would be if people who come to our Church to worship could be met and greeted like that as they enter the Church for Eucharistic celebration? Thinking about this and getting buried into my thoughts, I could hear a voice saying to me, "The good news is that you have more than enough people in the Church to make this happen; the bad news, though, is that they have not yet volunteered. Amazingly, at the Parish Council, this past Monday night, the issue of our need for more Ministers of Hospitality came up, and I decided to cry out to the parishioners for help.

As we know, Eucharistic celebration is not a private devotion but a communal act. So, anyone who enters our Church for liturgical celebration needs to feel comfortable and welcome. As the Bible says, "welcome one another as Christ has welcomed you" (Rom 15:7).

Ministers of Hospitality are often the first point of contact for people when they enter the church building for Mass. That first greeting (or non-greeting) sets the tone for each individual person. It can either provide a sense of belonging and connection, welcome and acceptance, or it can lead to a feeling of indifference, insignificance, isolation, rejection and detachment, none of which foster unity or reflect our oneness in the body of Christ. Therefore, we need Ministers of Hospitality to welcome people at the door, provide them with all the necessary books and aids, and help them find their places in the worshipping assembly; so that we can communicate one simple message. "You are welcome, and I am happy that you have come to worship with us". There is power in first impressions.

A study-group from the North American Academy of Liturgy visited a parish in Harlem, New York, for a Sunday Eucharist. After Mass, a group of parishioners met the group to discuss their experiences. A member of the group asked the parishioners, "Where in the liturgy do you experience God most?" Without hesitation, several of the parishioners replied: "In the welcoming community."

As you can see, if we want our Church to grow, if we want our Church to become a beacon of light in this world, if we want our Church to become a kingdom of Heaven on earth, then we must all do whatever is necessary to encourage, to empower, to enlarge, to expand, and to enlist our services into our Hospitality Ministry. The fact is that it does not take any more time than you would have spent in Sunday worship. Rather, it takes that same time and turns it into a ministry for your Church, a service to God and neighbor, and a fulfillment of one of the eternal requirements, as Scripture says: "I was a stranger and you welcomed me, come and inherit the kingdom prepared for you by my Father" (Cf. Matt 25:35ff). It is like killing three birds with one stone. You can't beat that.

My beloved parishioners, your parish, St. Michael's Church needs you now more than ever to serve as a minister of Hospitality. In this pandemic environment, we need our able parishioners to sign up and help us serve the needs of this Church in our welcoming ministry. Training and everything you need to excel in this ministry will be provided for you. Please call the Parish office at 908-688-1232 to register. May God bless you as you answer this call to serve His Church!

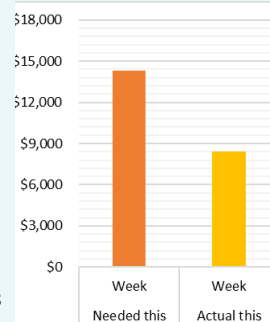

FIRST RECONCILIATION:

Dates for your child's First Reconciliation have been scheduled. There will be two services and they will begin at 10:00 am in the Church.

Children whose last names begin with A-L will attend on SATURDAY, JULY 18TH.

Children whose last names begin with M-Z will attend on SATURDAY, AUGUST 1ST.

Due to Church guidelines and restrictions, we are only allowed 100 people in the Church at this time. ***This means only one parent and one child can attend the reconciliation service.***

Your child can receive this sacrament ONLY IF we have received proof of their Baptism. If you have received a letter asking for proof and have yet to provide it, please do so immediately. Letters were only sent to those who have not provided proof.

If you need to change the date of the reconciliation, please call the office as soon as possible. Please call or email the office once you have received the letter packet.

PARENTS OF CHILDREN IN OUR RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAM:

REGISTRATION PAPERS FOR THE 2020-2021 CCD YEAR have been mailed. Please register your child for religious education classes. If you know of someone who has a child entering the first grade, please ask them to contact the Religious Education Office. We will send registration papers to them. Special classes are available for older students who haven't had any prior religious instruction.

PARENTS OF SCHOOL-AGED CHILDREN: Religious education begins in first grade and continues through grade eight. Children usually receive the sacraments of First Reconciliation (Confession) and First Eucharist (Communion) in the second grade. Most children are confirmed in the ninth grade, as long as they have completed grades one through eight. If you have a child who needs to make up classes, please contact the Religious Education Office.

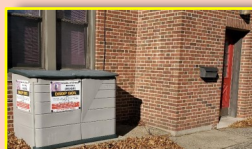
