



Message From *The Pastor's Desk*



My dear friends,

We are about to enter into the Lenten season, a time we are called to be more attentive to the word of God and prayer and to prepare ourselves through the virtues and practices of penance, abstinence, fasting, and alms-giving for the renewal of our baptismal promises at Easter.

During this period, **Abstinence** and **Fast** are obligated on certain days:

Abstinence refers to the practice of not eating meat on the day prescribed. This will be Ash Wednesday and every Friday during the Lenten season up until Easter Sunday. Those aged 14 and above are obliged by the law of abstinence.

Fast refers to eating only one (1) full meal in a day and two (2) small meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity. One full meal a day is ideal. Ages 18 through 59 years are obligated to fast. Medical conditions must be considered in any fasting regulations. The days of fasting are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible, the fast on Good Friday should extend to Easter Vigil (Holy Saturday night—"Paschal Fast") to honor the suffering and death of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, and to prepare ourselves to share and celebrate more fully and readily, His Resurrection.

Easter Duty: The time for fulfilling "Easter Duty" (the obligation for all Catholics who have made their First Holy Communion to receive communion at least once a year) extends from the First Sunday of Lent, February 26, to The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, June 4th, 2023.

For all of us Catholics, it is essential to note that the obligation to observe, in spirit and truth, the laws of **Fast** and **Abstinence** is a solemn obligation and is not to be taken lightly. It is also essential for us to know that the Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are days of penance, not abstinence, in which case, each of us may substitute the traditional abstinence from meat with some other practice of voluntary self-denial, as penance.

My friends, as we fast during this Lenten season, I encourage us to fast in ways that can help us grow our relationship with God, with spouses, family members, relatives, and friends. Let us fast in ways that build bridges of love, respect, unity, friendship, and community. Let us fast in ways that tear down the destructive walls of injustice, division, discrimination, anger, hatred, bigotry, jealousy, wrath, and apathy. Let us fast in ways that help build our self-image, sense of worth, and confidence as children of God, Most High.

When it comes to almsgiving, let us not just give material things but also give in ways that make this world a better place for all of us to live. Let us show love and friendship, encouragement and empowerment, support, and goodwill. Let us reach out to touch the brokenhearted and those who thirst for fundamental rights and privileges; let us keep our minds, hearts, and time open, for we are the ones God has put in this world to make a difference.

ST. MICHAEL'S COLLECTIONS

Below is an explanation of some of the different St. Michael's Collections:

S.O.S. Collection - This is a monthly "restricted" collection dedicated to paying our utility bills. **Restricted collections are not assessed by the Archdiocese of Newark and therefore all funds are used solely by St. Michael's to pay our bills.** S.O.S. collections are appreciated at all times.

Tithing - This is a monthly "restricted" collection dedicated to paying for the new air conditioner. **Restricted collections are not assessed by the Archdiocese and therefore all funds are used solely for St. Michael's needs.** Tithing collections are appreciated at all times.

Assessment Collection - The Archdiocese of Newark assesses all parishes in the Archdiocese, and a percentage of the parish's annual unrestricted revenue, is paid monthly. This assessment is used by the Archdiocese to support administrative services. St. Michael's has instituted a monthly "restricted" collection that is used solely for paying our monthly assessment.

All Assessment Collection funds are sent directly to Archdiocese of Newark, monthly, to pay our Assessment Obligation. No funds are used for St. Michael's needs.

National Collections - the Archdiocese of Newark has ten collections during the year to benefit various organizations such as the retired priest's fund, the church in Eastern Europe, the religious retirement fund, and mission appeals.

Money from the national collections go directly to the Archdiocese of Newark.

St. Vincent De Paul Collection - money donated to St. Vincent De Paul is distributed prior to Thanksgiving and prior to Easter to local foodbanks, soup kitchens and social centers that provide food and shelter for those in need.

A HERO WALKED HERE.

The story and aftermath of a Saint Michaels School graduate, a 21-year-old Rutgers University Student and volunteer Fire Fighter and his line of duty death while trying to save a woman from her burning home.
