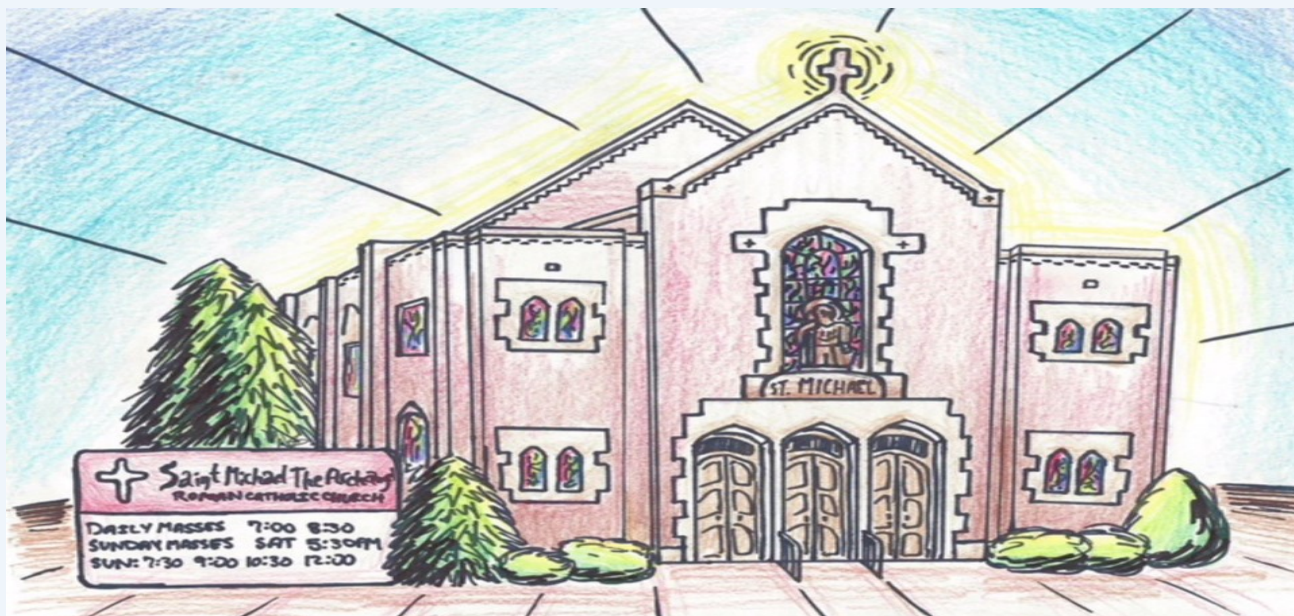

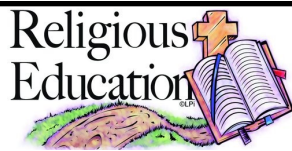

### SPECIAL NEW YEAR MESSAGE

*As we celebrate Christmas and enter into the blessings of the New Year, I just want to share this simple reflection about the mystery of life. The seed for this thought was planted in me while I was watching the beautiful fireworks displayed by the township of union this past July 4th independence Day celebration. We were all sitting in the parking lot of the church and you could hear the shots go off, then the fireworks rising and shining, and finally blasting into the air scattering its beautiful colors.
