FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



Feeling Helpless but not Hopeless



My friends, it is very hard to hold unto faith when life events conspire to bring us down to the dust. The first reading on this fifth Sunday in Ordinary times, Year B (Job 7:1-7), introduces a man

named Job, a righteous and upright man who, upon hearing that all of his possessions had been destroyed and his children killed, said, "Naked I came from my mother's womb, and naked I will depart. The LORD gave, and the LORD has taken away; may the name of the LORD be praised" (Job 1:21). But these words of great faith quickly evaporated when his sufferings intensified with his body afflicted with such terrible sores that he couldn't stand, sit, or lie down, nor find relief from his pain. His wife suggested that he end his misery by cursing God and his friends condemned rather than console him. Even God, whom he had served so faithfully, seemed to have ignored him, refusing for a long time to answer him and rise to his cause. Consequently, "I prefer strangling and death, rather than this body of mine... Let me alone; my days have no meaning...I will never see happiness again" (Job 7:15, 16b) became his words. A pillar of faith had been brought down to despair and feelings of hopelessness. Indeed, faith can get a workout in the face of life's tribulations.

This is why St. Paul warned in 1 Corinthians 10:12, "If you think you are standing firm, be careful that you don't fall!" When life tribulations pound us again and again, it is hard to stand firm and the feelings of helplessness can easily set in. The feeling of helplessness is different from the feeling of hopelessness. Helplessness is a feeling that things have gone awfully wrong without any light at the end of the tunnel in sight. Yet, in the midst of this feeling, there is a belief in the barest possibility that the dust will settle; a sustaining

hope that allows one to keep going just in case. On the other hand, hopelessness is the feeling that things have gone awfully wrong and there is no need to keep going. There is no room for faith or hope. It is a determined desire to give up and not give life a chance. This leads to all kinds of negative outcomes, including desperation and suicide. Job's situation led him to feelings of helplessness but not hopelessness. That is why hung despite all odds, and eventually saw the restoration of all his fortunes. Hope occupies the space between the feelings of helplessness and hopelessness.

When we are faced with desperate situations, let us remember the words of Scripture: "Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name; you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you, and... you will not be swept over. When you walk through the fire, you will not be burned; the flames will not set you ablaze. For I am the Lord your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior" No matter how helpless things look, remember these words of Scripture: "No temptation has overtaken you except what is common to the human race. And God is faithful; he will not let you be tempted beyond what you can bear. But when you are tempted, he will also provide a way out so that you can endure it".

My friends no matter what we are going through, there is always the barest possibility that we may come through to the other side of our desire. Our blessings often lie on the other side of our pain. May the Lord never allow us to be tempted beyond what we can handle!

Stewardship of Treasure

ST. MICHAEL'S COLLECTIONS

Below is an explanation of some of the different St. Michael's Collections:

S.O.S. Collection - This is a monthly "restricted" collection dedicated to paying our utility bills. **Restricted collections are not assessed by the Archdiocese of Newark and therefore all funds are used solely by St. Michael's to pay our bills.** S.O.S. collections are appreciated at all times.

Tithing - This is a monthly "restricted" collection dedicated to paying for the new the upkeep of the Church boiler and airconditioner. **Restricted collections are not assessed by the Archdiocese and therefore all funds are used solely for St. Michael's needs.** Tithing collections are appreciated at all times.

Assessment Collection - The Archdiocese of Newark assesses all parishes in the Archdiocese, and a percentage of the parish's annual unrestricted revenue, is paid monthly. This assessment is used by the Archdiocese to support administrative services. St. Michael's has instituted a monthly "restricted" collection that is used solely for paying our monthly assessment.

All Assessment Collection funds are sent directly to Archdiocese of Newark, monthly, to pay our Assessment Obligation. No funds are used for St. Michael's needs.

National Collections - the Archdiocese of Newark has ten collections during the year to benefit various organizations such as the retired priest's fund, the church in Eastern Europe, the religious retirement fund, and mission appeals. **Money from the national collections go directly to the Archdiocese of Newark.**

St. Vincent De Paul Collection - money donated to St. Vincent De Paul is distributed prior to Thanksgiving and prior to Easter to local foodbanks, soup kitchens and social centers that provide food and shelter for those in need.

TO ALL OUR PARISHIONERS: PREVENTING SCAMS IN OUR PARISH

There is increasing use of many Pastor's names, via email or text message, to try to scam parishioners. They have tried it severally with many pastors in our diocese. Please do not be scammed. You can prevent this by taking a few things in consideration.

- A. If you receive a text message or email and you don't know your pastor's phone number or email, do not reply to the message sent in his name unless it comes from the Parish Office. **You need to call the Parish and verify the message.**
- B. If someone texts, emails or calls you in a way that implies urgency, attempting to get you to act quickly before you have time to carefully read and examine the message. Be careful how you respond. Verify first.
- C. If you receive any text, email, or call pressuring you to send funds via gift cards for whatever reason, by asking you for the code numbers or PINs on the back of the cards so that the card can be redeemed immediately, be careful how you respond. Verify first.
- D. If you receive any text or email, or call telling you a story about the urgent need of your pastor or someone you don't relate with at that level, that involves a medical emergency, being stranded somewhere, or for travel needs, be careful how you respond. Make sure the phone number or email address is verified.

We just need to be smart and we can beat these attempts at scamming parishioners. It is nearly impossible to locate where the scam is originating from or the number being used. What we can do is to be watchful. Always look at the number and email from which the message is being sent. If it is not a number or email address you are familiar with, your best bet is not to respond or verify before you respond.

2024 LENTEN REGULATIONS

1. The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday (February 14) and Good Friday (March 29). If possible the fast on Good Friday is continued until Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence. On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted and two (2) smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity.

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obligated to fast.

On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by law of abstinence.

2. The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence "substantially", or as a whole, is a serious obligation.
3. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.
4. The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty) extends from the **First Sunday of Lent, February 18** to **The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, May 26, 2024**.

Canon 920, SI. All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.
